Swatara Park Features

Arora and Associates developed the Park Master Plan for the **Swatara Township Park**. This plan was prepared through a collaborative effort between the Arora, citizens, the township and Mayor of Jonestown. Arora conducted design and planning meetings with the shareholders to develop the most versatile facility given the size of the property. At these meetings, Arora used the site mapping and several planning aids to mock up the park site with proposed recreational facilities. This allowed the township supervisors and members of the planning committee to visualize the property. The master plan was developed with an option to expand the park onto vacant adjoining land to the north. As Jonestown and Swatara are contiguous neighbors, effort is being made to develop recreation programs that complement each other. This park is intended to provide recreational opportunities for local residents and residents of surrounding neighborhoods and as presented in the Swatara Township Master Plan document. The park includes an environmental observation and education area along the existing wetlands at the southern edge of the park. This facility will serve to educate the public while providing protection for important natural resources. This plan has been developed to support grant applications for implementation funds. The implementation plan has been developed in phases that will best serve the community needs and budget.
